

## My Friend Maisy



She is four years old just like me.




We play together all the time.

Mum and Dad are always there to make sure we play safely.




There are times when we like to be left on our own.

They must never pat her on the head or cuddle her around the neck.




One day, while I was walking down the street with Mum, a strange dog came up to us.

I knew we had to stand still, keep our hands down, stay as quiet as a mouse and look at the ground.




Soon the dog lost interest and walked away.
